

This Indenture Witnesseth, That Charles James Beard of No 30, South Commercial Road with the consent of his Wife the same address doth put himself Apprentice to Libia Worn of Number 48, South Commercial Road, East London Cooper

to learn his Art; and with him (after the Manner of an Apprentice) to serve from the day of August one thousand eight hundred & eighty two

until the full End and Term of Seven Years from thence next following, to keep, his lawful Commands every where gladly do. He shall do no Damage to his said Master nor see it to be done of Others; but that he to his Power shall let, or forthwith give warning to his said Master of the same. He shall not waste the Goods of his said Master, nor lend them unlawfully to any. He shall not play at Cards, Dice, Tables, or any other unlawful Games, whereby his said Master may have any Loss. With his own Goods or Others, during the said Term, without Licence of his said Master, he shall neither buy nor sell. He shall not haunt Taverns or Playhouses, nor absent himself from his said Master's Service Day nor Night unlawfully. But in all things, as a faithful Apprentice, he shall behave himself towards his said Master, and all his, during the said Term. And the said Master doth covenant and agree to give the said

Apprentice the sum of Four shillings per week for every week for the first year the sum of Five shillings per week for every week for the second year the sum of 1 1/2 shillings per week for every week for the third year, and two shillings for every week for the remaining term of his apprenticeship. In four years and the hours he shall be required to work shall be from 6 o'clock a'm to 6 o'clock p.m daily

his said Apprentice, in the Art of a Cooper which he useth, by the best Means that he can, shall teach and instruct, or cause to be taught and instructed; sending unto his said Apprentice Lodging, and all other necessaries during the said Term.

but the said Master Libia Worn shall not be bound to pay any wages in case of illness that will hinder the said apprentice to discharge his duties as such apprentice but in case of any accident whilst in his Masters employ the said Libia Worn covenants to pay unto the said apprentice the same wages he may be receiving at the time of such accident up to the space of three years hereafter during the continuation of such illness through accident.

And for the true Performance of all and every the said Covenants and Agreements, either of the said Parties bindeth himself unto the other by these Presents.
